

Over 400 people toured the New Brighton Public Safety Center on October 7, 2003 during dedication and opening of a stateof-the-art Public Safety Center.

Construction on this \$7 million center started April 1, 2002 and was completed on September 30, 2003.


The center houses the Police and Fire departments. The building was built in two phases, completing the Fire Station first before demolishing the existing fire station to make room for the Police department.

The building includes: an eight stall Apparatus Bay that houses a variety of trucks for the Fire Department;

TEAMWORK

FLYING IN A "V" FORMATION

Naturalist Milton Olsen wrote on the behavior of geese to make a point about teamwork.

"This spring when you see geese heading back north for the summer flying along in "V" formation, you might be interested in knowing what scientists have discovered about why they fly that way. It has been learned that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own."

Basic Truth No. 1: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

"Whenever a goose falls out of formation it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front."

Basic Truth No. 2: There is strength and power (safety

too) in numbers when traveling in the same direction as others with whom we share a common goal.

"When the lead goose gets tired, he rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point."

Basic Truth No. 3: It pays to take turns doing hard jobs — with people or with geese flying north.

"These geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed."

<u>Basic Truth No. 4:</u> Those who are exercising leadership need to be remembered with our active support and praise.

"Finally, when a goose gets sick or is wounded by gunshot and falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow him down to help and protect him. They stay with him until he is either able fly or until he is dead, and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group."

Basic Truth No. 5: We must stand by those among us in their times of need.

It's all in the DETAILS!

There were approximately 30,000 cy of soil that had to be removed from the site.

EDS had a grain size distribution test completed to find out what kind of soil was on the site. The soil turned out to be a very good structured sand which was used at other sites.

In the bidding documents EDS included a line item for the contractors to give a credit for the soil.

This ended up saving the City of New Brighton at least \$25,000. This was money they could use toward other items on their "wish list".

More DETAILS.....

The project broke ground in April of 2002. In June and July the project was literally "under water" because of the heavy rains.

Every construction project in the metro area was the same. EDS overcame this rain disaster by:

- Contouring the site so the water drained away
- · Created a water flow plan
- Connected the building to floor drains
